The braces made from ceramic or plastic, if not placed behind the teeth, are usually virtually invisible, aside from being so small. However, ceramic and plastic braces take longer to get used to, and patients often feel discomfort weeks after fitting them. Every six weeks, an orthodontist will have to replace the wires, or tighten them.

It was very visible and her teeth were all over the place. After getting her four wisdom teeth removed, she followed her dentist's advice to get braces fitted, so as not to let her remaining teeth move around freely.
