Car Coolers Can Help You Stay Cool on the Road

Before the heat consumes you on your next road trip, consider getting a [Car Cooler](#). This is great for everyday travel. Forget about the conventional coolers that take a back seat and warm drinks when you want them cold or cold drinks when you want them warm. The cooler/warmer is truly a gadget roadrunners fall in love with easily.

What Do You Use Car Coolers for?

The makers of car coolers had in mind your travel convenience. If you are traveling with children and babies, the cooler can keep baby bottles warm and drink/snacks cold. A cooler that is plugged to the car's cigarette lighter does away with messy melting ice. It's a portable fridge without the bulk. The top picks for this type of travel companion are coolers with insulated cup holders and room for dry items. This all-in-one cooler can be used as a mini storage for nappies and wipes.

For a fleet of vans, this type of cooler keeps drivers comfortably set off with cold drinks and snacks. There is no need for them to have time-consuming meals at road stops along the highway enroute to their destination. This translates to work efficiency and more business "mileage." For little cars, the cooler gives you storage space. Knowing all these pluses, would you still take that road trip without this cooler?

Brands and Features

Igloo 2707 Kool Cruiser can hold up to 18 quarts and is tall enough to be able to hold 3 L bottles. It's lightweight, but it can cool things up to 40 degrees Fahrenheit below ambient temperature, with quiet operation. It's a gray and white cooler, and has a replaceable thermoelectric lid, very lightweight. With 12 VDC power, you can adjust it to either cool or warm function. The one drawback with this cooler is that you'll need to replace the motor quite frequently.

The Koolatron is featured next, and is a competitor to Igloo. It's better in some cases, and has no necessity for frequent motor replacements. The lid, however, can begin to "chip" with constant use, opening and closing. However, if you only use the cooler infrequently, this won't be a drawback for you. You simply plug the Koolatron into your car's 12 V cigarette lighter for power, although you should be aware that this can cause some overheating for some of these coolers, similar to the Igloo. Its cooling temperature is a steady 40 degrees F.

The Wagan EL 2577 7-liter fridge/warmer is next in line, with both drinks and food kept at perfect temperatures. No ice needed to keep food and snacks at the perfect temperature, so you can have more room for actual food and drink. This is perfect for families who are on the go all the time.

Which Cooler Should You Choose?

For a long road trip, with children in tow or none, it is best to have a cooler in the car with you. Having a cooler eliminates the need for frequent stopovers in strange places or spending money on unhealthy food. The best type of cooler for long trips is the hard cooler.

Soft coolers will do well for short trips, where you need to pack just a few bottles of cold juice or sandwiches.
