Combi Micro-Wave Cookers - Can You Justify the Added Price?

The primary advantage to using a [combination microwave oven](#) over a normal microwave is that by combining your microwave and your convection oven in one system you are getting rid of the need of owning both. Traditional ovens are quite often the biggest single item you have in your kitchen, so by getting rid of the requirement for an oven you stand to save lots of space. This could be useful if for instance you were considering getting a dishwasher but had no room to put it. Alternatively, you may live in a high-rise apartment where there is simply no room for an oven, but you might be able to find countertop space for a combination microwave oven. You may think that a microwave oven could never be a substitute for a proper convection oven, but many of the higher-end models even feature an integrated grilling function.

Larger Capacity for Cooking

Even if you do not have a lack of space and you are really attached to your oven there are other good reasons that you may still look into buying a combination microwave oven. A further major reason why it may be beneficial for you is if you have a large family or often cook for a substantial number of people then it may give you an increased ability. If you make a proper Sunday roast every week there is every chance that by the time you have put the meat in the oven you do not have room to put anything else in there like potatoes or other vegetables. If you owned a microwave which was able to cook these items like a regular oven then you would not have to sacrifice them because of a lack of room.

Time Saving Devices

An additional benefit which a lot of people might probably not be aware of is that a [combi microwave oven](#) can in fact function as a great time saving device. A great many of the latest combo microwave ovens actually permit you to opt to microwave heat food and use old-fashioned convection heating at the same time. As the food is being heated up in two different ways this actually lets the food cook quicker while avoiding the risk of charring. So if you are somebody who finds that large chunks of your time are spent waiting around for things to cook, a combination microwave oven could be just what you need.

The Decision is Yours

When all is said and done, combination microwave ovens commonly are more expensive to buy than a regular microwave and so they're not suitable for everybody. If you recognise any of the issues that I have specified here though then it is fairly probable that you would benefit by investing that little bit more in a combination microwave oven instead of a regular cooker.
