What Kind of Food Processors Does Cuisinart Have to Offer?

A wide range of Cuisinart food processors can be found for purchase, and it's particularly hard to select the very best of the range of Cuisinart processors, because such a judgement depends on every users' own needs. Some models were given bad marks seeing as the contents were either too soupy or too chunky, but often that is a consequence of not consulting the explanatory literature that Cuisinart includes. On top of that, a few were described as very difficult to clean correctly. Some of the top quality Cuisinart food processors benefitted from high marks in cases where a larger amount of the components were detachable and therefore easier to sanitize, rather than the models that had incorporated one-piece assemblies of many of their pieces. The Cuisinart DLC-X Plus Food Processor is designed for chefs who cater or have small restaurants. It has a bowl made to hold 20 cups, three slicing disks for different sized slices, in addition to a shredding disk, a dough hook, and even comes with a "whole-sized fruit and vegetable feed tube", although if you don't routinely prepare grand piles of food in your kitchen, this model will not be very appealing to the home cook, yet it is positively recieved by users in nearly every test performed.

Many people are especially impressed by the Cuisinart DLC-2014 Power Prep Plus as it has a large 14 cup bowl, thus it will capably handle three pounds of pasta, or fourteen cups of cheese. The drawback is that it sells for quite a bit, but if you are seeking the totally "best" food processor that Cuisinart could make for the serious chef, this could be worth the expense. Customers who have used this appliance state that it is particularly good at slicing and shredding; they appreciated the large volume, in addition to its superlative performance for kneading dough. It easily handled many heavy-duty chores. Most cooks reported that they were quite taken aback that the device came with a three-year warranty from Cuisinart instead of the typical twelve-month warranty which has been common for their food processors. Perhaps a better alternative would be [Cuisinart BFP-703CH Blender/Food Processor](#).

The Cuisinart Model # DLC-8S is regarded as a custom food processor. It includes an exclusively designed containment apparatus along with a super-sized feed tube that offers a very convenient lid for safe dicing and kneading. Each of the DLC-8S's attachments are driven by Cuisinart's industrial quality motor, that so many cooks value because of the power that this dynamo offers to the busy cook. This 11-cup device has been considered as a powerhouse that is intended for both user friendliness in addition to providing years of use. Many really love the convenient "whole-sized fruit and vegetable feed tube" as mentioned above. It has a comprehensive 5-year motor warranty with just a limited 3-year warranty which applies to the entire device.

Cuisinart DLC-10S is a small sized model for people who do not have use for the commercial grade machines which could handle restaurant-sized volumes. This example is a 7-cup volume food processor that is said to be made to accomplish the normal kitchen necessities for chopping, slicing and even kneading although the batches must be kept small. It includes a full five-year warranty on just the motor yet Cuisinart offers a limited 3-year warranty applied to the complete unit. Many of the complaints regarding this model have come from those who feel that the replacement parts in addition to the disks and blades are too expensive.
